UPGRADING YOUR COMPUTER

Installation precautions

Before you install any computer component, we recommend that you read the following sections. These sections contain important ESD precautions along with pre-installation and post-installation instructions.

ESD precautions

Electrostatic discharge (ESD) can damage your processor, disk drives, expansion boards, and other components. Always observe the following precautions before you install a computer component:

- Do not remove a component from its protective 1. packaging until you are ready to install it.
- 2. Wear a wrist grounding strap and attach it to a metal part of the computer before handling components. If a wrist strap is not available, maintain contact with the computer throughout any procedure requiring ESD protection.

Required tools

In performing the component replacement process, you will need the following tools:

- Philips screwdriver
- Hex screwdriver
- Flat screwdriver
- Scissors



Note

The screws for the different components vary in size. During the disassembly process, group the screws with their corresponding components to avoid mismatches when putting back the components.

Pre-installation instructions

Always observe the following before you install any component:

- Make sure that the ODD and card reader slot is empty. 1.
- Turn off the power to the computer and all peripherals. 2.
- Unplug the power cord from the computer. 3.
- Unplug the network cable and all connected peripheral 4. devices from the computer.
- Place the computer on a flat, steady surface. 5.
- Open your computer according to the instructions on 6. removing the left side system cover on page 4 and removing the right side system cover on page 5.
- See the following sections for specific instructions on 7. the component you wish to install.



Marning

Not turning off the computer properly before you start installing the components may cause serious damage. Do not attempt the procedures described in the following sections unless you are a qualified service technician.

Post-installation instructions

Observe the following after installing a computer component:

- See to it that the components are installed according to 1. the step-by- step instructions in their respective sections.
- Replace any expansion boards or peripherals that you 2. removed earlier.
- Replace the system covers. See Installing the left side 3. system cover on page 5 and installing the right side system cover on page 6.
- 4. Connect the necessary cables.
- 5. Turn on your computer.

System Upgrade

Removing the rear system cover

- 1. Before you proceed, make sure that you have turned off your computer and all peripherals connected to it. Read the Pre-installation instructions on page 2.
- 2. Remove the screw that secure the rear system cover to the computer.



3. Take off the rear system cover.



Set the cover aside for re-installation later. 4.

Installing the rear system cover

- 1. Align the cover to the bottom part of the computer's rear side.
- 2. Push the rear system cover until it latches into place.




3. Secure the rear system cover to the computer using one screw.



4. Observe the Post-installation instructions on page 2.

Removing the left side system cover

- 5. Before you proceed, make sure that you have turned off your computer and all peripherals connected to it. Read the Pre-installation instructions on page 2.
- 1. Remove the two screws that secure the left side system cover to the computer.
- Slide the cover toward the back of the computer and 2. pull away from the side of the computer.



3. Set the cover aside for re-installation later.

Installing the left side system cover

- 1. Align the cover to the sides of the computer and slide the cover toward the front of the computer.
- 2. Secure the cover with two screws.



Observe the Post-installation instructions on page 2. 3.

Hard drives

The computer supports installation of two 3.5-inch SATA hard drives in the internal HDD cage.

Removing the 3.5-inch hard drives

- Perform the <u>Pre-installation instructions on page 2</u>. 1.
- Disconnect the power and data cables from the hard 2. drive.



3. Remove the hard drive from the chassis.



4. Pull both sides of the HDD carrier (1) then remove the hard drive (2).



Installing the 3.5-inch hard drives

- Remove the new hard drive from their packaging. 1.
- 2. Place the hard drive into the carrier (1) and reinsert the retaining screws into the hard drive (2).



Insert the hard drive into the chassis. 3.




4. Connect the power and data cables to the hard drive.



5. Observe the Post-installation instructions on page 2.

Memory

The computer has four DDR4 U-DIMM slots that support up to 64 GB maximum system memory.




Memory configuration guidelines

- To ensure data integrity, use only Acer-approved DDR4 2400 MHz or DDR4 2666 MHz type memory modules.
- Memory modules must be installed starting with DIMM1 slot.
- Always handle memory modules by its edges.
- When installing memory modules, populate the DIMM slots according to the table below.

Removing a memory module

- 1. Perform the <u>Pre-installation instructions on page 2</u>.
- 2. Remove the graphics board. See Removing the graphics board on page 14.
- 3. Press outward the holding clips on both sides of the DIMM slot outward to release the memory module (1).
- 4. Gently pull the memory module upward to remove it from the DIMM slot (2).



5. Repeat steps 3~4 to remove the other memory modules.


Installing a memory module



DIMM slots on the mainboard must be installed only in certain configurations. Numbers next to DIMM slots correspond to installation sequence. Be sure to install the memory module in DIMM1 slot followed by DIMM2 slot.

- 1. Select an empty DIMM slot.
- 2. Remove the new memory module from its packaging, handling it by the edges.
- Align then insert the memory module into the DIMM 3. slot (1).
- Insert the memory to the slot until the retaining clips 4. snap inward (2).

The module is keyed so it can only be inserted in one direction. If the module does not fit, make sure that the notch in the module lines up with the tab in the memory slot.




- 5. Repeat steps 1~4 to install the other memory modules.
- Replace the graphics board. See Installing the 6. graphics board on page 16
- Observe the Post-installation instructions on page 2. 7.

Graphic board


The computer contains one or two Graphic boards installed in the PCIE x16 slots. The detail configuration will be differed by different models.

Removing the Graphics board


- 1. Perform the <u>Pre-installation instructions on page 2</u>.
- 2. Remove the screw that secures the graphics board to the chassis.



3. Unlatch the metal clip that secure the graphics board to the chassis.



- 4. Release the latch that secures the graphics board to the mainboard (1).
- 5. Detach the graphics board from the PCIE x16 slot (2).



Installing the Graphics board

- 1. Remove the new graphics board from its packaging.
- 2. Insert the graphics boards into the PCIE x16 slot and press it down until it latches into place.



Note


For replace/upgrade graphic board, please check the specification of graphic board & power supply first in order to make sure the graphic board and power supply could work.



Press the metal clip to secure the graphics board 3. bracket.



4. Secure the graphics board to the chassis using one screw.



5. Observe the Post-installation instructions on page 2.

M.2 SSD module

The computer contains one M.2 SSD module installed in the M.2 PCIE slot.

Removing the M.2 SSD module

- 1. Perform the <u>Pre-installation instructions on page 2</u>.
- 2. Remove the graphics board. See Removing the graphics board on page 14.
- 3. Remove the screw that secures the M.2 SSD module from the mainboard.



4. Detach the M.2 SSD module from the mainboard.



5. Remove the thermal pad from the SSD module.




Installing the M.2 SSD module

- 1. Remove the new M.2 SSD module from its packaging.
- 2. Place a thermal pad into the SSD module.



3. Insert the M.2 SSD module into its slot in the mainboard.



Secure the M.2 SSD module to the mainboard using 4. one screw.

- Observe the Post-installation instructions on page 2. 5.

To set up the ConceptD Palette application (Windows 10):


- 1. From the Start menu, select All apps.

Monitoring


Select the Monitoring tab to view CPU, GPU and system performance.

Split Screen


Select the Split Screen tab to configure your screen display.

App Center


Select the App Center tab to view the applications that are avilable for quick access. You can add frequently used applications to this tab by clicking the "+" sign.
